## 2: Purpose of the School Improvement Advisory Committee (SIAC)

- -(Per Iowa Code 280.12 ) -- To serve in an advisory role and make recommendations to the board of directors regarding:

  - > Student learning goals
  - ➤ Long-range and annual improvement goals that include, but are not limited to, the state indicators that address reading, mathematics, and science achievement.
  - Desired levels of student performance.
  - Progress toward meeting the goals
  - > Harassment or bullying prevention goals, programs, training, and other

initiatives.

➤ Infusing character education into the educational program

## 3: Review Nevada CSD 2024-25 Goals:

## -Central Elementary:

- 1. By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 92% of Kindergarten-Fourth grade students will meet grade level expectations or show one year of growth in reading.
- Teachers will be provided differentiated, small-group support and feedback to enhance their growth related to SEL - 100% of classroom teachers will teach all 20 of the universal SEL lessons (either Second Step or Harmony) by the end of the school year.
- 3. By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, all EK-4 classroom teachers will have implemented Bridges mathematics curriculum in their classrooms.

## -Nevada Middle School:

1. Continuing to implement the collaborative teams approach and enhance fidelity in MTSS across tiers 1, 2, and 3, with the goal of ensuring that 90% of students reach or surpass grade-level proficiency, or achieve expected grade-level growth.

## -Nevada High School:

1. Increased implementation of MTSS plan - both academic and social-emotional behavioral health - in Tier 1.

  - -Ensure that proper interventions are taking place and we are focused on one year of growth for all learners.

### -NMS: FAST & ISASP Data

- -Above 80% as a whole in ELA & Math
- -Growth in 6th grade ELA
- -Big shoutout to 7th grade 90% in Math & ELA
- -Why does 5th grade continue to drop each year?
- -Do FAST & ISASP scores correlate?
- -Dissect math data/trends to ensure 8th graders are prepared for 9th-grade math.
