4.1 Elementary Computer Science – Corey Barloon and Carrie Hillman both presented the Elementary Computer Science program available to EK-4th graders. Computer Science is problem solving with a computer, which can be a laptop, computer, or robots. It teaches the students how to think logically and how to problem solve with a computer.

EK focuses on social skills, problem solving, sequencing pictures, decomposing and sequencing with coding using indi robots and codes.

Kindergarten focuses on collaboration and hands on coding. Unplugged coding, learning how to give specific directions. Decomposing, breaking things apart. Building algorithms through Cubetto Robot and Beebot.

1st & 2nd grades focus on what a computer is made up of, how circuits work. Their circuit work was making circuits, Lil Bits, and Snap circuits. They built computers, learned parts, functions, and input/output. They were able to work on OSMO coding. Mr. Barloon mentioned that Iowa State was able to get the Computer Science program OSMO.

3rd grade works on coding a robot called Dash. The use the same tools/robtos as younger grades but the complexity of skills grows.

3rd & 4th grade worked on a video design game focusing on what's your story, who's your audience. Mr. Barloon shared a video game that a 4th grade student created, showing the creativity and complexity of the game. The video game design was a lot of fun and very challenging, as they had to take so many steps designing their games.

Going forward Ms. Hillman and Mr. Barloon would like to bridge the gap for computer science program between Elementary and Middle School.
